Outwith by Bedwyr Williams is the second Observers' Walks, Collective's series of downloadable audio guides specially created by artists to be listened to on Calton Hill.

Bedwyr Williams' working practice spans live performances, film and installations. Often drawing on the banalities of existence, Bedwyrs' work merges art and life with an idiosyncratic twist.

Outwith is performed by Scottish actor and writer Hilary Lyon and takes the listener through a series of stories created by the artist which all take place at a hotel visible from Calton Hill.


